We are parents and guardians. We are teachers and staff. We care about our children. We want to build a better Burgess. We are you.


Every parent and guardian is already a member of the PTO. Please get involved. We welcome your participation. Even as little as an hour or two can make a significant difference.

From the Nurse's Office



Asthma is a lung disease that makes it difficult to move air in and out of the lungs because of inflammation and narrowing of the airway. According to the American Lung Association, asthma is the leading cause of chronic illness in children. It affects over 9% of children in the United States and, for unknown reasons, is steadily increasing. At Burgess this year 85 students (9.7%) have a diagnosis of asthma. Asthma can begin at any age but most children have their first symptoms by age 5.

These symptoms include (while these are some symptoms of asthma, your child's doctor should evaluate any illness that complicates your child's breathing):

- A chronic cough (which may be the only symptom)
- Less energy during play
- · Shallow, rapid breathing
- · Complaint of chest tightness or chest "hurting"
- Whistling sound when breathing in or out -- called wheezing.
- · Shortness of breath
- · Tightened neck and chest muscles while breathing
- · Feelings of weakness or tiredness

This year we have a 5th grade Asthma Super Group who meet once a month. They would like to share some information regarding their asthma to help others to better understand.

- M.H shares that the symptoms she experiences with her asthma are coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath and a heavy chest.
- A.C. states that she knows she needs her inhaler when it becomes hard for her to breathe and can end up being scary. She states that once she went to the hospital by ambulance in September with an asthma attack and they think it was triggered by her dog shedding.
- S.N. feels that the best way to help a friend when they are having an asthma attack is to tell a teacher or parent, get the nurse, offer a cold drink and keep them calm. J. S.D. states that offering ice cream works for him because it is cold.
- J.S.D. shares that the name of the inhaler he uses is Qvar twice daily all year to keep his lungs strong. When he coughs or wheezes he uses Albuterol nebulizer treatments.

The hardest thing about having asthma is:

- A.C. Managing asthma and keeping track of refills and medications.
- M.H. Sometimes having to miss sports or needing to take a break during the game
- J.S.D.-Missing class time to get treated with medication

From the Library

Burgess has a school-wide subscription to the very reputable World Book Encyclopedia. If you want to use it at home, just go to worldbookonline.com.

The Username is: student61; Password is: learn.

These days the World Book Encyclopedia comes in three levels, Kids, Student and Advanced. Here at school we recommend the Student level for grades 4-6, while the Kids level is great for grades K-3. The Kids level comes with games and activities. All three levels offer additional resources for further learning about many topics, tucked into the articles. Stunning photos, videos and audio clips round out this solid resource.

Unlike many web pages, The World Book Encyclopedia is free of advertising. Articles are written and signed by experts. Users should be aware that searches must be by topic keyword, not by questions. For example, if you want to who was Julia Child, just type in her name. Usually the WBE won't let you type in a full question. Fourth graders have been practicing forming keywords in their library lessons with the World Book these past few weeks.

So, next time you need answers to research questions, try the World Book!


Additional Program Information


