What the PTO does


By raising funds, we are able to provide school supplies, field trips, cultural events and more, and in turn, improve the educational experiences of our children.

Library on the Trail

In this season of gratitude, I want to express mine for the parents and community members who built the Burgess Discovery Trail behind the lower ballfield.

Third graders recently used the trail during their library class for a nature experience inspired by a read-aloud of the book Giving Thanks: A Native American Good Morning Message, by Chief Jake Swamp. The author is Haudenosaunee, a member of the Six Nations of upstate New York and Canada. He explains that in this tradition children are taught to greet the world each morning by saying thank you to all living things. Our Burgess third graders went into the small woods of the Trail to discover what was living there, or placed there, note their observations in their writing journals, and find something they particularly liked.

I am grateful to Sturbridge parents and members of the Trails Committee for providing the means to this experience. With occasional maintenance, this trail, and its possibilities, is bound to last a long time.

MCBA Reading Deadlines Extended

The library's Massachusetts Children's Book Award program (MCBA) got a huge boost from the fall Scholastic Book Fair, thanks to Book Fair chair Michelle Phillips. At her request, Scholastic sent a special display full of books from this year's list. Students and parents were able to purchase their own

copies of favorite books, and children younger than grades 4-6 were able to get in on the MCBA action.

The state-wide reading "challenge" is restricted to grades 4-6. Meanwhile, thanks to a fourth grader's suggestion, deadlines for two of the three incentives have been extended. The first deadline, for anyone reading five or more books, remains at the end of February. Burgess students will cast their votes then for their favorite, along with the rest of the state's participants.

Anyone with the goal of reading 10 or more from the list, to earn a free book from the Spring book fair, now has until Mid-March. And, any student who manages to read the complete list of 25

books by the end of May will be invited to a pizza party, in the library, in June.

At this time, fourth graders are the most avid participants, with many of them already eligible to

vote in February, and some already qualifying for a free book in March. As always, participating students need to do a quick book response through the library web
